What is the Community Hospital?

The Community Hospital (OdC) of Minturno is a healthcare facility for hospitalization of the territorial network that serves as an intermediate link between the home and the hospital. Its jurisdiction includes the municipalities of Minturno, Castelforte, Spigno Saturnia, and Santi Cosma e Damiano, and serves a population of 34,210.

Its primary objective is to prevent inappropriate hospital admissions and promote protected discharge to locations suitable for clinical stabilization and recovery of independence, as close as possible to the patient's home. The facility is barrier-free and has 20 beds, divided into rooms with one to four beds, all equipped with bathrooms for those with disabilities.

The facility also features shared spaces for socializing, a lounge area for meals, and outsourced general services such as cooking and cleaning.

The Minturno Community Hospital is open 24 hours a day, Monday to Sunday.

Access Methods and Admission Criteria

Access to the OdC is by prescription from the Medical Doctor

General Practitioner, Territorial Specialist, or Hospital Physician for hospitalizations lasting a maximum of 30 days.

Who can access?

The service is intended for fragile patients with exacerbated chronic diseases or clinically stable people coming from hospital wards who require a period of stabilization before returning home.

Clinical inclusion criteria:

For admission, clinical stability is required, verified through objective parameters, specifically a Clinical Instability Index (MEWS) with a score ≤ 2 and a Care Dependency Index (IDA) ≥ 2 .

“The Community Hospital is a place of local care, conceived as a bridge between the hospital and one's home to ensure continuity of care and promote the recovery of autonomy in a safe environment close to one's loved ones.”

Treatment Paths and Services Offered

The clinical activity is based on an Individual Assistance Project (PAI) which integrates nursing, medical, and rehabilitation services. The rehabilitation staff conducts functional assessments and early mobilization programs, while also training patients and caregivers in the use of aids to facilitate a safe return home.

The facility also provides access to basic diagnostic services, such as blood tests and ECGs, and manages complex therapies, including oxygen therapy and parenteral nutrition. Each treatment is supported by a

computerized clinical-assistance record connected to the File

Electronic Healthcare (EHR), ensuring that health information follows the patient through every stage of the treatment journey.

Healthcare and Nursing

It is the heart of the structure, guaranteed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week

What we offer: Continuous surveillance, management of drug therapies, monitoring of vital signs and management of complex devices (catheters, stomas, oxygen therapy)

Team: The service is provided by 8 nurses (including the coordinator) and 6 Social Health Workers (OSS)

Medical Assistance

Clinical responsibility is entrusted to a doctor who collaborates with the General Practitioners (GPs).

Attendance: Guaranteed for 4.5 hours a day, 6 days a week.
Continuity: During night hours and on holidays, assistance is guaranteed by the Continuity of Care Doctors.

Rehabilitation and Functional Assistance

The facility has equipped rooms for physical activities.

Activities: Functional assessment, reactivation programs for early mobilization, and training in the use of assistive devices for the patient and their caregivers.

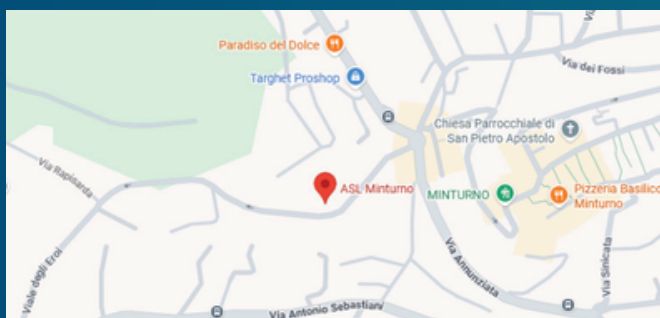
